Key findings

1658 comments were received

Response was overwhelmingly positive

Positive Comments - highlights (Number received, percentage of total comments)

Top 3 areas of interest overall - observing wildlife (133, 9.8%), cycling (132, 9.8%) & walking (121, 8.9%) fig (iv)

Other points of interest:

Play areas, for adults and children (78, 5.8%) fig (viii)

"Somewhere to have a cup of tea" - visitor centre/café (65, 4.8%) fig (ix)

Facilities for picnics and bar-b-queing (41, 3.0%) (fig (ix)

Beach/swimming -pool & lake (39, 2.9%)

Rowing lake support (39, 2.9%)

Boating activities non-specific (38, 2.8%)

Trees (38, 2.8%)

Horseriding/ponytrekking (37, 2.7%)

Water ski/sailing school (31, 2.3%)

Camping/caravanning sites - there are very few in Bedfordshire (30, 2.2%) fig (ix)

Within "sport" - climbing and abseiling were the most popular activites (24, 1.8%) fig (vii)

Concerns (Number received & percentage of total comments in brackets) see figs (iii) & (v)

Top 3 areas of concern - security/safety (28, 1.7%); Access (17, 1%); East-West Rail (17, 1%)

Other points of interest that are worthy of note:

Overdevelopment (15, 0.9%)

Funding/cost (14, 0.8%)

Noise & intrusion (14, 0.8%)

Motorsports (13, 0.8%)

Retention or loss of natural countryside (13, 0.8%)

Vandalism & Anti social behaviour (12, 0.7%)

Excessive commercialisation (10, 0.6%)

Impact on Route 51 (10, 0.6%)




Fig (ii) Positive comments grouped according to area of interest or activity




Fig (iv) Top 10 desires





Fig (v) Top 10 concerns




Fig (vii) "Facilities for sport"




Fig (viii) "Child specific activities"
